#### **Executive Director's Report** Brittany Burley



Looking back at the past year, I'm thrilled with all we've been able to accomplish. Continuing last year's trend, we've had another year full of

positive change and growth. Here are just a few of the things we've accomplished in 2017:

- Helped over 8,500 people in H-N!
- Grew our campaign by 7.5% over last year!
- Moved to a new office location saving \$12K/yr

• Hosted our 1st Annual Campaign Kick-off Jail & Bail that raised \$15,000!

• And so much more!

In 2017, United Way provided funding to 17 programs that changed lives in Haldimand and Norfolk. In addition to our existing programs, we are now partnering with Strong Start to support their Letters, Sounds and Words<sup>™</sup> program. Children in Pre-Kindergarten and Grade One identified as lagging behind in literacy skills are paired with volunteers that play carefully designed games and activities with them that increase their literacy skills. As a long-time supporter of adult literacy, we are proud to now be helping at the onset of literacy challenges to create brighter futures to these students in need.

In addition to the ongoing programs United Way supports through our Member Agencies, this year we also offered free financial literacy workshops in partnership with volunteers from Libro Credit Union and Albert Smelko from Norfolk Law Chambers. The courses offered covered; An Introduction to Basic Budgeting, Loans You Don't Want, Loans: Costs & Obligations, and Estate and Will Planning. The feedback from the sessions was overwhelmingly positive.

In October, we welcomed Canadian Filmmaker Krista Loughton to our community to present her documentary 'Us & Them.' The documentary 'shatters misconceptions about why people end up on the streets, and reveals why the "pull yourself up by the bootstraps" narrative is heavily flawed.' After the screening, we hosted a Q&A with Krista and discussed the challenges facing our community.



2017 saw a number of exciting events and fundraisers take place, including our 2nd Annual Fashion Show for United Way at Coach Pyramids in Caledonia, our 2nd Annual 12 Days of Pizza fundraiser with Domino's Pizza in

Simcoe, bi-weekly BBQ's over the summer at Turkstra Lumber in Simcoe, several Day of Caring events in our community, and more!

Our continuing success would not have been possible without the help of our many supporters. We are surrounded by fantastic volunteers who spend countless hours helping United Way further its mission, and for that we are grateful. Thank you especially to our board members for their dedication and guidance as we continue to transform to become the best United Way we can be. Thank you to the staff at our Member Agencies who work hard daily to help others. A big thank you goes to the Erie Beach Hotel and the Schneider family for graciously hosting our AGM every year. Finally, we thank every donor and supporter. To those who donate through your workplace, make a corporate gift, attend one of our events, or simply tell others about the work we are doing, please know that we appreciate you.

We eagerly await the opportunities that await us in 2018 as we continue to grow our capacity, and with it, the number of lives we impact.
